CAUTION

Law enforcement officials are seeking the public's assistance in identifying a serial bank robber who has allegedly robbed at least twelve banks in and around the Orange County, California, area since February 17, 2010.

During each robbery linked to the "Gone Plaid Bandit," a lone male suspect approaches the victim teller, presents a note demanding cash, and then threatens the teller with a weapon. The suspect has worn baseball hats with oversized bills, sunglasses, and plaid shirts. In some robberies, the suspect has been described as having worn an ACE-type bandage on his right hand. He may also wear his facial hair styled in a "soul patch."

The "Gone Plaid Bandit" is also suspected in robberies in Fullerton, Yorba Linda, Anaheim Hills, Irvine, Mission Viejo, Laguna Niguel, Marina Del Rey, and Los Angeles- all in California. The last robbery occurred on April 27, 2013.
