DESCRIPTION

Height: 5'5" to 5'9"

Weight: Approximately 290 pounds

Sex: Male

Build: Large

Remarks: On September 11, 2015, the unknown suspect wore a dark baseball cap with a San Francisco 49ers logo, a maroon shirt with a collar, blue jeans pants, and white shoes. On July 23, 2016, the unknown suspect wore a dark baseball cap with a yellow logo, eyeglasses, a blue long-sleeved button-up shirt, blue jeans pants, and dark shoes. The suspect had a thick mustache.

Weapon Used: The subject reached for what appeared to be an object under his shirt. The outline of the object observed under the shirt could have been consistent with a firearm, and the subject verbally threatened to shoot the victim teller with a gun.

CAUTION

On September 11, 2015, at approximately 2:20 p.m., an unknown subject robbed the Wells Fargo Bank located at 2940 West Valencia Road in Tucson, Arizona.

The unknown suspect initially entered the Safeway store, where the Wells Fargo Bank is located, at approximately 1:28 p.m. He walked around the inside of the store, seemingly observing the teller booths, then left the store.

At approximately 2:20 p.m., the suspect re-entered through the east entrance of the store, approached the western-most teller bay, and demanded 100s, 50s, and 20s while

threatening to pull his gun out. His hand was positioned under his shirt, where the victim teller noticed the outline of a square-shaped object. The teller then gave money to the unknown suspect.

The unknown suspect then exited the Safeway through the western-most entrance, which was out of view of the teller.

On July 23, 2016, at approximately 11:40 a.m., the same unknown subject robbed the same Wells Fargo Bank location.

The suspect approached the teller counter and demanded money. The suspect gestured like he had a gun. The teller gave the suspect money and the suspect exited through the main south-facing entrance.
