UNKNOWN BANK ROBBER



DESCRIPTION

Sex: Male

Race: White

Remarks: The robber wore a grey hooded sweatshirt, grey sweatpants, blue billed baseball hat, sunglasses, gloves, red plaid scarf wrapped around his face, and boots. He had a black string drawn bag with a logo on it.

Weapon Used: Handgun

CAUTION

The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Pittsburgh Division and the Cranberry Township Police Department are seeking the public's assistance in identifying the unknown male responsible for robbing the First Niagara Bank located at 20111 Route 19, Cranberry Township, Pennsylvania, 16066, around 2:25 p.m., on January 20, 2016. The robber, a lone White male, walked into the bank and used a gun to demand money from bank employees. He held the gun in his left hand. Tellers gave the robber an undisclosed amount of money from the bank and he left through the front door. He was last seen walking behind the Giant Eagle supermarket located adjacent to the bank.

The robber is described as follows:

- Race: White
- Sex: Male
- Height: 5'8" to 5'10"
- Age: Approximately 30 years old
- Weight: 170 pounds
- Build: Stocky

A reward will be offered for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the robber.
